Hello, everyone. Today, I'm going to tell you about the word in my *mind. It is the word "why." I think it has a wonderful *power. I'll show you some examples.

When I was in Japan, the Japanese people around me often didn't *express their ideas and *opinions *clearly. So I was sometimes (①) because I couldn't understand what they had in their minds.
